1 j	learning contents	This module provides an insight into Anglophone literary studies as well as the main literary theories and methods of analysis of the 20th and 21st centuries. Students are given a sound introduction to the sub-areas of "poetry analysis", "drama analysis", "narrative text analysis", "analysis of media genres", "basic concepts and epochs of English and American literary history" in order to then explore in detail various literary theories of the 20th and 21st centuries. In addition to works of literary theory, the seminar participants will read and work on genre-typical primary texts from the field of theatre and narrative texts. The set topics are addressed in detail in the context of discussions. This module focuses on the specialist and methodological skills of literary studies, which, together with the analogous skills of the other sub-disciplines, form the content-related basis for the further course of study. Students are enabled to discuss literary			

		issues in a differentiated and critical manner and to select and apply appropriate methods for dealing with literary problems. In addition, basic key competences of self-directed learning and working, text type-specific writing as well as information procurement and management are acquired.
