About the lecture:

Since the Lisbon Decision of the Federal Constitutional Court, there has been frequent mention of constitutional identity. This usually refers to national constitutions and their protection against the claims of European law. Increasingly, however, the question of a European constitutional identity is addressed. The lecture will discuss the meaning of constitutional identity with respect to the European Union and what it might consist in.

About the lecturer:

Dieter Grimm is one of Germany's most distinguished legal scholars. He is a Professor Emeritus of Public Law of the Humboldt University of Berlin and former Rector of the Wissenschaftskolleg Berlin. For many years, he also lectured at the Yale Law School in the United States. From 1987 to 1999 he was a judge at the Federal Constitutional Court.
