Professor Becky P.Y. Loo is Head of the Department of Geography and Director of the Institute of Transport Studies at the University of Hong Kong (HKU). Her current research interests are transportation, e-technologies (defined as microelectronics, informatics and telecommunications) and society. In particular, she is interested in applying spatial analysis, surveys and statistical methods in analysing pertinent issues related to sustainability, including carbon dioxide emissions from transport sources, regional transport infrastructure (including airports, ports and railways) and development, transit-oriented development, walkable communities, and road safety. She already has over 300 publications (including nine books and 104 research journal articles, excluding Editorials and Book Reviews).
