#### Beschreibung:

This module delves into the relationship between social media and hate speech. It is divided into three sections. Section one will examine the notion of hate speech and hate speech regulation from a historical and sociological perspective. Section two will look at social media platforms' moderation, and section three will consist of a series of practical workshops. These workshops will explore our understanding of the conditions that contribute to the proliferation of hateful content on platforms, as well as techniques developed to counter its appearance, volume, and effects.

Objectives: By the end of the module, the student will:

- Understand what hate speech is and what hate speech regulation entails.
- Be capable of recognising policies and strategies that platforms implement to govern hateful content.
- Critically understand and analyse the governing techniques and practices platforms use in the governance of hateful content.
