Blended Intensive Program on Digital Constitutionalism and Digital Sovereignty:
Navigating Power and Rights in the Digital Age

Description:

The seminar is part of an Erasmus+ funded blended intensive program (BIP) between the University of Bremen, the University of Salerno (Italy), the University of Padua (Italy), Dublin City University (Ireland), the University of Groningen (the Netherlands), Tallinn University (Estonia), and other partners. The 2025 BIP "Digital Constitutionalism and Digital Sovereignty: Navigating Power and Rights in the Digital Age" explores the relationship of human rights and power with relation to digital technologies such as platforms, the Internet and AI. It aims at providing students with the theoretical, analytical and methodological tools to make sense of the values and principles that (should) guide regulatory arrangements for the digital age, while critically addressing actors' interactions, strategies and power positions as well as power limitations in the same context.

Students will participate with their peers from the others universities in a virtual component in early May and in June and in a five-day intensive week of in-person instruction and group work at the University of Salerno, Italy, 26-30 May 2025. The Bremen-based cohort of students will hail from the BA Media and Communication Studies. All participating students will receive Erasmus+ funding to participate in the in-person component. Students will receive 6 CP from the University of Salerno, which would usually be recognized in the KMW7 module or as general studies credits.

Please note: Participants will be selected through an open call sent to the email list of the BA Media and Communication Studies. Only selected students will be admitted to the course environment on Stud.IP. Advanced English language skills and the availability for the full program are participation requirements.
