

**Level plan for teaching at the University of Bremen in the case of increasing COVID-19 incidence / hospitalization rates during the winter semester 2021/22**

Basis: The currently valid State Corona Ordinance, the warning level that applies to Bremen State (§1(2) Corona Ordinance), and the current University of Bremen safety and hygiene concept.

Implementation: The crisis team will make decisions concerning the suitable measures depending on the political decisions made on a national and state level, the infection situation in Bremen State, and the infection situation on the university campus.

Measures:

1. Social distancing of 1.5 m between people is to be adhered to in areas of movement but can be waived in classrooms and student learning spaces.
2. Mouth-nose covering (medical-grade mask)
  - a. There is no obligation to wear a mouth-nose covering on campus.
  - b. The obligation to wear a mouth-nose covering only applies in buildings, learning spaces, and classrooms when social distancing of 1.5 m between people is not possible.
  - c. The obligation to wear a mouth-nose covering applies in all buildings, including classrooms - even after you are seated. Only those holding the class are exempt from this regulation. Outside of buildings and on campus it is only obligatory that a mask be worn in areas where crowds may form, e.g. A building entryways.

3. Lectures
  - a. All lectures can take place in person. However, technical facilities for parallel streaming of the lecture should be used or recording and distribution should take place via OpenCast in Stud.IP.
  - b. Only online lectures are possible.
4. Seminars, practical classes, tutorials
  - a. All seminars, practical classes, and tutorials can take place face-to-face.
  - b. Only a few individual seminars that are of particular relevance for degree courses are possible face-to-face.
  - c. Only online seminars, practical classes, and tutorials are possible.
5. Teaching formats that cannot be digitalized, face-to-face examinations
  - a. Laboratory sessions, similar teaching formats that cannot be digitalized, and face-to-face examinations are able to take place face-to-face on campus.
  - b. Laboratory sessions, similar teaching formats that cannot be digitalized, and face-to-face examinations must be postponed or take place online.
6. Student working opportunities at bookable spaces on campus
  - a. It is possible for students to work in the spaces on campus that can be booked.
  - b. It is not possible for students to work in the spaces on campus that can be booked.
