1. CHILDCARE

1.1. Childcare in the State of Bremen

Registration for a childcare space is possible year-round in Bremen. If you are interested in a municipal facility, please use the official registration period in the previous January of each year in order to obtain a childcare space at the beginning of the respective kindergarten year. You can contact your preferred municipal or independent childcare facility directly. More flexible registration periods are offered in some cases for privately run daycare facilities and on-campus childcare facilities.

As childcare in Bremen and Bremerhaven begins in August of each year in all facilities, it may be that no childcare space is available during the year. In these cases, you can contact the placement service of KiTa Bremen. As the demand for childcare spaces in Bremen is very high, we recommend that you look for a childcare solution as early as possible.

1.2. Contribution Exemption for Children over Three Years of Age

Since 2019, parents in Bremen have not been paying day-care fees for the care of children aged three to six. Excluded from this exemption from contributions are lunchtime meals, after-school care, and day care for children under three. The exemption from contributions applies only to children with a permanent residence in Bremen.

1.3. Childcare on the University Campus

You will find numerous childcare facilities on the campus of the University of Bremen. They provide a wide range of offers tailored to the different needs of employees and students. The initiators of the facilities are private and municipal institutions, parents' associations, and the University of Bremen, as well as Studierendenwerk Bremen and the Allgemeiner Studierendenausschuss of the University of Bremen (AStA – students' union).





1.3.1. Uni Kita e.V.

Uni-Kindertagesstätte e.V. is a parents' association that offers an attractive all-day care program to help children feel at home, let off steam, experience, and discover.

- >>> Target Group: Children of students and employees
- » Age of the children: : One to three years (expansion is planned with a group for children over three)
- >>> Facility Size: 48 children in six groups
- Care Staff: Each group has two pedagogical staff members and usually a third person (approved spe-cialists or students or interns during their voluntary year of social work)
- Educational Program: Excursions in the nearer surroundings; music education, exercise programs, seasonal parties, educational partnership between parents and care staff

1.3.2. EntdeckerKids and Entdeckerhaus

- » Facility Size: 80 children under three years (eight groups), 80 children over three years (four groups)

- » Facility Size: Ten children
- >-> Care Staff: The group has two educators and one permanent employee.
- Educational Program: Satisfying elementary needs through safety, attention, movement, appreciation, peace, self-determination, learning, and discovery with all senses

1.5. UniKLEX – Flexible Childcare for Researchers in the Qualification Phase

Working in science often means working at times when regular care is not available. Due to the lofty requirements with regard to mobility, there is often no family network that could fill in, especially during the academic qualification phase. In particular, the all-day events, interdisciplinary continuing education courses, and conferences are essential building blocks for establishing a network in the scientific and academic communities. With the UniKLEX (Flexible Childcare) project, the University of Bremen wants to close this gap in childcare and support you in reconciling family responsibilities with your academic qualification goals. 1.6. Vacation Camps for Children of Employees

Particularly during the school breaks, it is not always easy for parents to ensure that child-care is available for the entire period. For this reason, the university — in cooperation with Verein für Hochschulsport e.V. — offers one week of campus recreation for children aged six to twelve during the Easter and fall breaks as well as two weeks during summer break.


3.2. Family Room
