Our History

Founded in 1881, the University of Liverpool is the original 'redbrick' university. We are one of the founding members of the prestigious Russell Group, comprising the top 24 research-intensive universities in the UK, and we rank in the top 200 universities worldwide for internationally recognised research. Our Expertise

The University of Liverpool is a world-class player in many areas of academia. In science and engineering, we were a key partner in the discoveries at the CERN reactor in Switzerland and some of the world leaders in chemistry are based at our University. We are home to one of the UK's top departments of Archaeology, Classics and Egyptology, the only Institute of Irish Studies outside of Ireland and an AACSB-accredited Management School. HISTORY OF LIVERPOOL

The history of Liverpool can be traced right back to 1190. It is here where the River Mersey meets the Irish Sea and the city is steeped in maritime history. Liverpool remained a small settlement until it established successful trade routes with Africa and the West Indies, India and the Far East.

Over the next two centuries the volume of trade passing through the docks saw Liverpool grow into one of Britain's most important cities and it became known as 'the New York of Europe', reaching its pinnacle of economic success at the start of the twentieth century. Due to the importance of the docks, the city suffered relentless bombing during World War II, a blitz second only to London's.

Starting in the early 1960s, the city became internationally renowned for its youth culture, particularly music and the distinctive "Merseybeat" sound which became synonymous with The Beatles.

Liverpool's impressive waterfront is a UNESCO World Heritage Site and this city, named as the European Capital of Culture 2008, now has a global reputation for sport, music, and architecture. The people of Liverpool are strong-willed and determined, famously friendly and welcoming, witty and most of all, intensely proud of their city.

WHAT DO OUR STUDENTS HAVE TO SAY?

I chose the University of Liverpool because of its location. Liverpool is in the north of England, making travelling within the UK and Ireland extremely easy. I spent so many weekends in Scotland, Ireland, and Wales because they were all within a few hours on a cheap train or plane. Whatever your sporting interests and ability there is something for everyone at Liverpool. Join one of our 53 student-led sport clubs or participate in sport at a recreational level. Our Sports and Fitness Centre at the heart of campus offers a wide variety of facilities and services including a 25 metre swimming pool, squash courts, fitness suite, bouldering wall and dance studios. STUDY ABROAD OPPORTUNITIES

The opportunities available for you to study at the University of Liverpool depend on what type of partnership your university has with us:

- International Exchange: your university has an exchange partnership with us. Students from European partner universities may still be able to study with us on exchange. Please see our website for more details
- Visiting Study Abroad: you can study here as a fee paying visiting student even if your university doesn't have an exchange agreement with us. Visiting students from partner universities will receive a 10% tuition discount.

As a globally focused university we are proud to welcome hundreds of students every year to study, research or participate in our International Summer School here in Liverpool. Whatever your study abroad ambitions, there is an option for you!

Study Abroad +English

STUDY/ABROAD +English

- Participate in our 6- or 10-week English language pre-sessional course in the summer before studying abroad for Semester One or the full academic year
- Study to meet our English language entry requirements or simply to enhance your language skills before the semester begins!
- Take advantage of cultural activities and Liverpool's brilliant summer events to help you settle in to life in the UK.

Fees and Dates

Students can participate in the 6- or 10-week English language pre-sessional course in advance of Semester One. For students who don't yet meet our English language requirements, your current level will determine which length course you'll enroll in. Students who do already meet our requirement are encouraged to attend the 6-week course.

How to Apply

Students should apply through our Study Abroad application form, which can be found on our website. During the application process, you'll be able to indicate that you'd like to join the Study Abroad +English programme. At this time, we will confirm whether you'll participate in the 6- or 10-week English course based on your current level of English. Students who already meet our English language requirements may still participate in the 6-week course to improve their language ability before studying abroad.

Entry requirements:

A minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 (or equivalent). You can be in any year of study, however, we strongly discourage students from coming to Liverpool in their final year unless coming for Semester One only.

- Participate in one of our academic's research projects via our Summer Research Programme (all project modules are worth 15 University of Liverpool credits). Previous participants have had their work published in academic journals after completing the programme!

Fees and Dates

There are 3 intake dates over the summer (see table for dates). Each intake has an orientation session that you must attend.

How to Apply

You must submit an online application form by 15 March. As part of the application process, you are asked to upload your academic transcript, a personal statement outlining your interest in the project you are applying for and proof of English language qualifications (if required). Some projects require specific qualifications/experience, you should state how you meet these requirements in your personal statement.

Application Requirements:

- A minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 (or equivalent). You can be in any year of study (however supervisors may require specific experience to participate in their project)
- You must meet the English language requirements listed on our website.

Project timescales will be confirmed with your supervisor once you accept your offer. You must also attend a poster presentation as a part of your final assessment (the date for this will be agreed with your supervisor).

The Study Abroad team

Throughout your Study Abroad adventure with us, you'll be supported by our dedicated Study Abroad team. We will be your main central University contact throughout your experience, from your application to returning home.

Study Abroad buddies



The University has a range of accommodation options including the popular Study Abroad Village.

The Study Abroad Village (Tudor Close and Melville Grove) is open to both inbound exchange students and home students from Liverpool who have studied abroad. Additionally there are a range of accommodation options both on-and-off campus to choose from.

- Full Year students are guaranteed a place
- Semester One students can apply for a room in the Study Abroad Village – rooms are allocated on a first come, first served basis but there are usually enough rooms for students who request one
- Semester Two students are guaranteed a room in campus accommodation, where possible in the Study Abroad Village.

We understand that student accommodation is about the whole experience and not just the room. In all of our halls you are entering a supportive and safe environment where you will feel at home from the very beginning. Our team of Residential Advisors and Hall Student Committees are there to enhance your residence experience and you will be invited to social activities to help you get to know everybody living in your hall. It is often these initial friendships you make that stay with you throughout your time at university, and long after you've left.

Liverpool is one of the largest cities in the UK. Your actual living costs will vary according to your lifestyle, however a typical undergraduate exchange student, living in on campus accommodation estimates their monthly living costs as:

Exchange Students

In order to study on an exchange programme at the University of Liverpool you must first speak to your International Office to be nominated by your home institution. Once nominated you will be able to complete the online application process.

The deadlines for applications are as follows:

- Semester One and Full Year: 1 May
- Semester Two: 15 November.
