

## Publication of the Dissertation

(1) The PhD dissertation is to be published in book form, in journals, as a printed manuscript, or as an electronic publication. The author has to provide the Central Examinations Office with a sufficient number of free copies of the dissertation for distribution to the examinations board as well as the *Staats- und Universitätsbibliothek*:

1. 30 photocopied or printed copies for distribution on the part of the university, or
2. 10 copies printed on wood-based and acid-free durable paper together with due evidence of publication in a journal, or
3. 10 copies printed on wood-based and acid-free durable paper together with evidence of distribution of at least 150 copies via bookshops on the part of a commercial publishing house; the rear side of the title page is to contain mention of the purpose of publication and the university where the dissertation was submitted (please note that the PhD procedure is not completed until the 10 mandatory copies have been submitted!), or
4. the master copy of a microfiche and 30 additional microfiche copies. In this event, the author authorizes the university to reproduce and distribute additional copies of the dissertation in microfiche form, or
5. 8 copies printed on wood-based and acid-free durable paper together with an electronic version in accordance with the last amended version of the "Regulations Governing the Submission of Electronic Publications" issued by the *Staats- und Universitätsbibliothek*. In this event, the author authorizes the *Staats- und Universitätsbibliothek* Bremen, the Deutsche Bibliothek (DDB) in Frankfurt/ Leipzig, and possibly also the *DFG-Sondersammelgebietsbibliothek*, to publish the electronic version in certain data networks. The author has to verify that that the electronic version conforms to the originally submitted dissertation. The *Staats- und Universitätsbibliothek* has the duty to verify that the submitted electronic version conforms to the provisions of the "Regulations" in respect of readability and content. The submission of data that do not conform to these provisions, especially with regard to file format and storage media, does not constitute a publication.

(2) The dissertation can be published in a reworked or an abridged version.

In the event that the dissertation is to be published in a reworked or an abridged version, it is the duty of the author first to ensure that the chairperson of the examining committee or an

appointed deputy obtains the approval of all the members of the examining committee. In the event that the dissertation is to be published in a reworked or an abridged version, the subsequent publication must contain mention of the extent of the amendments that have been made.
